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Do's and Don'ts for House Hunters

Do's:

- When touring a home, check out the walls and doorways for any significant cracks that could be a sign of structural issues.
- Take note of any water damage that you may see which could be a sign of an underlying and potentially expensive issue.
- Pay attention to the state of the home. If it looks well taken care of you can usually assume that the homeowner took the time to keep up with routine maintenance.
- Use your nose. If you notice a significant amount of air freshener, that could be an attempt to mask the smell of an underlying problem.
- Did you notice an extra room that wasn't listed in the property sheet? This could be a sign that it was an unpermitted addition. If you're interested in the house be sure to ask your REALTOR® to confirm that the space is permitted.
- Check out the neighborhood. Find out if the area the home is in would suit your needs.
